When traveling with your dogs, you should always have copies of their rabies vaccination certificates.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four (4) months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.

No hand deliveries. Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary's address. Inquiries may be directed to Lisa Frankland at lisakblue@comcast.net. No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Online entries with an initial limit of 100 runs/day will be accepted through AKC's Online Entry Service. A free "My AKC" account is required to use this service. Go to www.akc.org/AgilityEntry and follow the instructions.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$25 collection fee to the amount of each returned check.

A wait list of up to 30 entries will be maintained until 6 pm December 27th, 2023, to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trials' closing date/time. All entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to 6 pm MST Wednesday, December 20, 2023. Any entries withdrawn by 6 pm December 27th, 2023 will be replaced by a wait-listed entry if any are available, and a full refund will be made for the withdrawn entry. Any wait-listed entry that does not move off the list into the trial by 6 pm December 27th, 2023 will receive a full refund.

OBSTACLES AND RING CONDITIONS

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. All classes will take place indoors on a dirt surface. Ring size will be a minimum of 95 ft x 95 ft.

CLASSES OFFERED & JUDGING TIMES

There will be a general briefing no earlier than 8:00 am each morning, with judging of the first class to commence at 8:30 am. Class order is tentative and subject to change. Walk groups (2-3) for Master/Excellent classes are dependent on final class counts and will be specified in the judging program that will be sent to all exhibitors after closing.

FRIDAY (Small to Tall): FAST (all levels), Premier JWW, Master/Excellent Standard, Master/Excellent JWW, Open Standard, Open JWW, Novice Standard, Novice JWW

SATURDAY (Tall to Small): Time 2 Beat, Master/Excellent JWW, Premier Standard, Open JWW, Master/Excellent Standard, Novice JWW' Open Standard, Novice Standard

SUNDAY (Small to Tall): Premier Standard, Premier JWW, Master/Excellent Standard, Master/Excellent JWW, Open Standard, Open JWW, Novice Standard, Novice JWW

Please consult the AKC Regulations for Agility Trials for a complete description and eligibility for entry into these classes. The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/height divisions. Dogs running in a lower height division than they are eligible for will be eliminated.

MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/wicketed by the Judge of Record PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. However, if a Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) or an Agility Field Rep is present; ALL dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog before its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

SIMPLIFIED JUMP HEIGHT CARD PROCESS

When filling out the entry form, there is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog needs to be officially measured. Please check the box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the Dogs To Be Measured List. It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dog's jump height card with your entry form or show it during day of show check-in.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes in which they are entered are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. Handlers with multiple dogs, at events with multiple rings may request to walk with a height group other than the one their dog is entered in if a conflict is imminent.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

MIXED HEIGHTS & CLASSES

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

FEO & FIX and GO ON

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

FEO allows exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is only offered in the Time 2 Beat and FAST classes. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) (T2B and/or FAST) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not
 eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on
 the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring. Toys must be non-audible and may not leave the handlers hand. Toys
 that roll freely may not be used.
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring.
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time.

Fix and Go On

FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score. Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the run.

RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

A New Title rosette will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title. A special rosette and decorated bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain their MACH/PACH. All awards must be claimed by the end of the trial. None will be mailed.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Durango Agility Dog Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. Exhibitors are expected to observe the AKC Code of Sportsmanship, including any posts or comments

made on social media. (https://images.akc.org/pdf/AKC_code_of_sportsmanship.pdf)
The Durango Agility Dog Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on

account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Durango Ágility Dog Club or any official thereof. **All dogs must be on leash** at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area

All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

REFUNDS

Entry fees will not be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in Agility Trials. As such, Durango Agility Dog Club will refund 100% per day of the entry fee paid for bitches unable to compete for this reason. In order to receive a refund, the Trial Secretary must be notified prior to the start of judging on the first day of the trial or cluster of trials.

RINGSIDE

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging if the dog has a valid temporary or permanent jump height card. Otherwise, they must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class if a VMO or AKC Field Rep is available to measure dogs. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

CATALOGS

A limited number of catalogs will be available for viewing at the trial secretary's booth. None will be sold. Running order sheets will be available to all exhibitors at no charge and posted online after closing.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

The McGee Park, San Juan County Fairgrounds, is located in the heart of the Four Corners just minutes away from Farmington, Bloomfield, and Aztec. McGee Park is one of the best facilities in the western region of the United States. The 80-acre fairgrounds are located two and a half hours northwest of Albuquerque, NM, and forty minutes south of Durango, CO.

Crating space will be available in designated areas only. Crates may be left overnight; however, Durango Agility Dog Club and the San Juan County Fairgrounds will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

There is no on-site food vendor for these trials. There are various restaurants nearby, and the SunRay Park and Casino's restaurant is within walking distance

Overnight/RV parking with hook-ups is available on the fairgrounds, about ¼ mile from the trial arena. No reservations--parking is on a first-come, first serve basis, though there is ample space for all. \$30/night with electric (there are no water hookups at this time of year), \$10/night dry. Pay RV fee in the fairground's office.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s) and for keeping their crating area clean. Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Any exhibitor leaving trash or broken equipment on the trial premises will be subject to a \$25 disposal fee.

DIRECTIONS TO THE TRIAL SITE

From Durango: Take US 550 S to Flora Vista, then CR 350 for 8.2 miles to McGee Park. **From Southeast Utah**: US 491 S or US 64 E to Shiprock, NM, then drive 34.8 miles to Rd 5568. **From Albuquerque**: Take US 550 N to Bloomfield, then left on US-64W for approximately 8 miles and turn left on Rd 5500 to enter site.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice **height division** for all **Regular** titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the **Preferred** classes **must** compete at the required jump height and **may not** compete in a jump height division **higher or lower** than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an **Agility Jump Height Card** may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine PartnersSM program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
